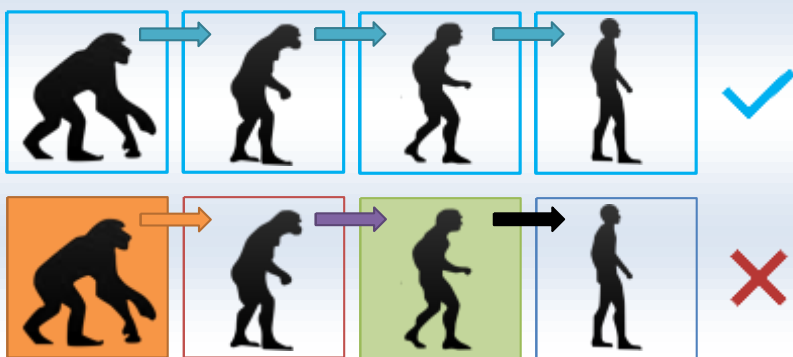

### Introduction & Background Information

Here are some notes to help you preparing your poster:

- Change the blank picture above to your personal picture which should be scaled to be 13 cm in height.
- Do NOT alter or change the university logo on the right. Same goes for the statement "مع تحيات قطاع الدراسات العليا والبحوث بكلية العلوم جامعة المنصورة" at the very bottom although you may use different font for it if you like.
- Insert thesis title, your name and affiliation, your supervisors' names and affiliations in the corresponding places replacing the dummy text.
- Try to keep the font sizes without much changes. It would look awkward if you use **very big** or very small font size while other posters (which could be displayed next to yours) use moderately sized fonts. Also try to keep the font size and face consistent across your poster. This template uses Verdana at 22.5.
- You should visualize the information as much as possible. In fact, figures, charts, tables and even equations help the reader to better understand your intentions with less reading.
- The printed poster is a piece of art. Try to be creative and have some taste with colors. It is OK to change the document background color to any bright color (or gradient) you like. However, make sure that your figures, tables and charts also use matching colors. For this template with white-blue gradient, the following sequence of figures looks nice but the next one is not. It looks ugly and inconsistent.



- This template defines main headers like Introduction, Methodology, Experiments, etc. You don't have to stick to this and you may introduce your work differently. Just make sure you use proper, meaningful headers but not dull headers like Chapter 1, Chapter 2, etc. Do NOT do that, ever!

- Add second headers if needed and make sure the colors are consistent.

#### Second header example

- You may use a separating line if you want but still keep its color consistent with the poster.
- Keep the poster in two columns.
- Do NOT alter or change the poster size. Although the size is set to 70cm x 140cm (due to PowerPoint limitations), you should make sure to print it on 100cm x 200cm sized material. The poster should scale up fine and will look great after printing.

### Methodology

Sometimes it is better to wrap the text around the visual objects (like figures or tables or an algorithm). Here's an example:

Let's talk about Darwin's Theory of Evolution for a moment. Do you think the elephant has descended from some type of dinosaur? The figures on the right shows great similarities between the two species! Don't you agree?
